

Airport Manager Report

February 2016

1. Av Fuel Sales were up dramatically for January and a tanker load of fuel was received. Although the wholesale price was about 40 cents lower, the retail price was left unchanged allowing us to make a slightly better profit margin. We are currently the lowest fuel price in the State.
2. Our T- Hangars are full!
3. February 11, and 13, will be the start of the next Ground School course. This course is a ten week commitment where we meet once a week for three hours. We are meeting on Thursday evenings from 6-9pm and Saturday mornings from 8-11am. I have 11 students registered.
4. On February 8, 2016, Terry Latting completed his first Solo flight. Terry was in the Fall Ground School and has continued on with his flight training. He had a total of 7 hours of dual instruction before he was kicked out of the nest. Very impressive Terry!
5. Joy and I are coordinating efforts for the upcoming annual Egg Drop, at the airport. The event date is April 2nd. I am engineering and constructing an improved egg drop contraption to fix previous squawks. We had over 400 in attendance last year, and we are hoping for more this year!
6. Pilot volunteers are being asked to participate in the Irish Parade Fly-Over. Last year we had 7 airplanes make a pass down McEwan prior to the parade starting. We were asked again to participate, but they wanted us to push our arrival time back 10 minutes so that the performance square wasn't drowned out by the sound of the passing airplanes. We will comply.
